£8.00 per session for a 6-week block, so £48 in total including all materials (15% discount for siblings).



Course outline: This term we will be focusing on developing skills in sculpture, painting, photographic work and drawing. Artists we will learn about are Anthony Craig (local sculptor), Van Gogh, Laszlo Moholy-Nagy, Banksy and Keith Haring. Techniques we will learn about include working in 3 dimensions, impasto painting, photograms, expressive drawing, composition and graffiti mark-making.

Optional activity I will be giving each child a sketchbook and a **FUN** drawing activity to take home each week. This is completely optional – I know how busy they are!

(Weeks 3 & 4 and weeks 5 & 6 are interchangeable depending on the weather – if week 3 or week 5 is wet, we will swap the activity for the next week's one and hope for better weather then!).

<b>2. 02/05</b> 	<b>Flower Painting</b>  Explore the work of Van Gogh, specifically looking at his sunflower flower paintings.  Create your own flower painting from real life flowers – hopefully sunflowers if available.	Learn about the master artist Van Gogh and his use of colour and brushmarks.  Practice painting with acrylics using thick paint – impasto painting. Try using different brushes and implements to make textured marks.  Explore colour mixing.
